

Short Biography

Dr. Salame-Alfie is the Acting Director of the Division of Environmental Health Investigations of the New York State Department of Health. Prior to this appointment, she was the Director of the Bureau of Environmental Radiation Protection. Since joining the Bureau in 1993, Dr. Salame-Alfie has been actively involved in radiological emergency response, evaluation of remedial actions for contaminated sites, radon and the radioactive materials and x-ray regulatory programs. She is the Chair of the CRCPD's Homeland Security Emergency Response (HS-ER-2) Task Force charged with the development of the Radiological Dispersal Device (RDD) First Responder's Pocket Guide, and the Handbook for Responding to Radiological Dispersal Devices companion handbook. Dr. Salame-Alfie is a member of the NCRP SC4-2 Committee charged with the development of the "Population Monitoring and Decontamination Following a Nuclear or Radiological Incident" publication and ASTM E54.2 Workgroup charged with the development of a competency standard for first responders. Dr. Salame-Alfie received her B.S. in Energy Engineering in Mexico City. Dr. Salame-Alfie received her Master's and Ph.D. in Nuclear Engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) in Troy, New York.
