JADWIGA (JODI) STRZELCZYK

Jadwiga (Jodi) Strzelczyk is Associate Professor of Radiological Sciences, in the Department of Radiology, University of Colorado at Denver, Health Sciences Center. She also holds a special graduate school faculty appointment in the Department of Preventive Medicine, Epidemiology and Biometrics.

In addition to didactic activities at the School of Medicine, Jodi (as she likes to be called) serves as the Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) for the University Hospital since 1995; as a scientific member on the High Risk Panel of the Colorado Multiple Institutional Review Board since 2002 and as a member of the Colorado State Radiation Advisory Committee since 2000.

Jodi has a M.Sc. degree in High Energy Nuclear Physics from Poland, a M.S. in Mathematics and Statistics (Industrial Management Track) from the State University of New York (SUNY) at Stony Brook, N.Y. Her doctorate is in Health and Behavioral Sciences from the University of Colorado at Denver. In her dissertation she explored factors that influence widely-understood compliance decisions.

Jodi's occupational experience prior to coming to Colorado includes ten-year tenure as the University Hospital RSO at Stony Brook and fifteen-year employment at two industrial firms on Long Island, NY in the capacity of radiation program manager.
