

Biographical sketch of STEPHEN CLARK

Stephen Clark is the Radiological Emergency Preparedness Program Director for the Georgia Emergency Management Agency (GEMA). Mr. Clark joined GEMA from the Birmingham, Ala.-based Jefferson County Emergency Management Agency in 2000 as hazard mitigation specialist, where he helped state and local decision-makers identify mitigation measures to reduce the financial impact of disasters and help save lives. In 2002, Mr. Clark was named senior analyst and assigned to the Georgia Information Sharing and Analysis Center (GISAC), the state's focal point for the collection, assessment, analysis, and dissemination of terrorism intelligence. While at GISAC, Mr. Clark evaluated threat information for its impact on emergency management and infrastructure, supervised the GISAC Threat Management Center, managed several information-technology projects, and served in the Intelligence Operations Center during the 2004 G-8 Summit, held at Sea Island, Ga. Mr. Clark received a Bachelor of Science in Social Work and a Master of Public Administration from the University of Alabama at Birmingham.
